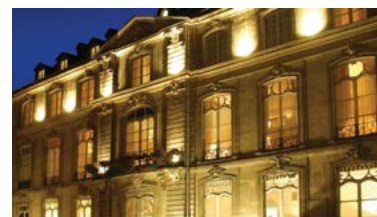

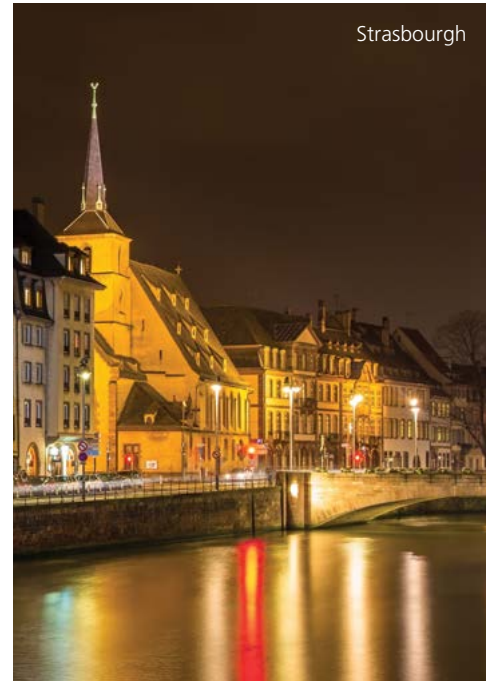

French contract law has finally been reformed by way of an ordinance published on 11 February 2016 and entering into force on 1st October 2016. The objectives of the Reform are notably the simplification, modernisation and, ultimately, attractiveness of French contract law. The Reform codifies a number of principles that have emerged in case law, thus stabilizing these solutions and improving legal certainty and does away with certain previous concepts, whilst introducing new ones that are inspired from other legal systems. All these amendments have an impact on French M&A transactions and will compel practitioners to change the way they draft certain provisions of transaction documents. 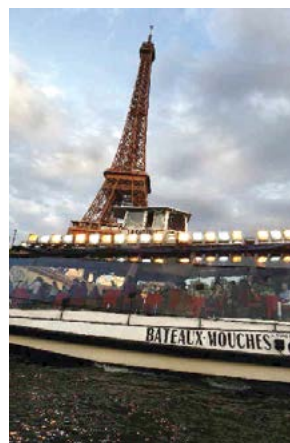
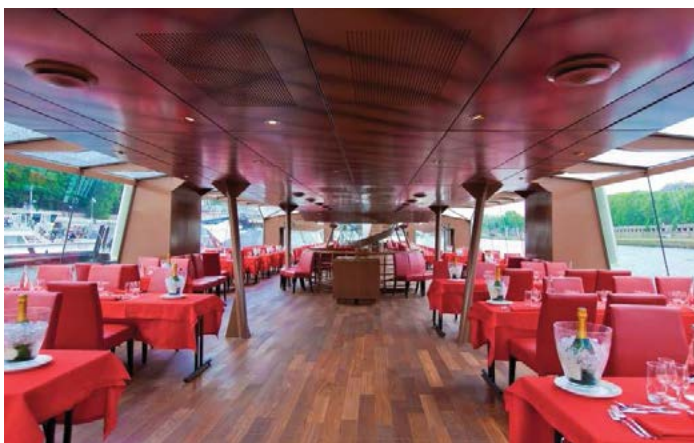

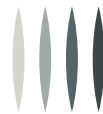
