

Robert A. Heverly is an Associate Professor of Law at Albany Law School of Union University. Prior to joining the faculty at Albany Law School in July 2010, Professor Heverly was as a Visiting Professor of Law at Michigan State University College of Law (from January 2009-June 2010). Before that he was a member of faculty at the University of East Anglia's Norwich Law School. He taught at UEA from June 2003 to December 2008, serving during that time as a Lecturer in Intellectual Property Law and Director of the LL.M. in Information, Technology and Intellectual Property Law. He has also taught in Trier, Germany, as a Guest Professor in the Common Law.

Prof. Heverly earned his LL.M. from Yale Law School, after which he undertook a Resident Fellowship with the Information Society Project at Yale Law School, where he retains an affiliation as a Faculty Fellow. Professor Heverly received a dual Bachelor of Arts (Broadcasting & Mass Communications Studies and Psychology) from the State University of New York College at Oswego (with honors), and his Juris Doctor (with honors) from Albany Law School of Union University.

Professor Heverly's research interests include intellectual property, technology and society (especially the Internet, computers, networks, and information law), media law, property, and globalization. He has taught Torts, Property Law, Art and Entertainment Law, Cyber/Internet Law, Copyright Law, International and Comparative Intellectual Property Law, and related courses.
