#### IV. Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare 1:30 p.m. – 2:30 p.m.

This topic will provide an introduction on the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in health care with a specific focus on legal, compliance, ethical and privacy concerns relating to the recent proliferation of AI technology. Machine learning, data and algorithms are increasingly being utilized to innovate and modernize healthcare service delivery to improve efficiency, clinical outcomes, medical research, and quality of patient care. Many health care entities that are currently using or planning to use various AI technology are covered by the Health Insurance Accountability and Portability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). From a regulatory standpoint, the panel will explain how HIPAA obligates covered entities to ensure the privacy of and maintain adequate security standards for protected health information (PHI). The program will also help attorneys learn how to navigate risks associated with the development, implementation, and use of AI in healthcare as well as the associated ethical obligations.
