

2023 State Legislative Wrap-Up: Women In the Law Section

We've come to the end of 2023, with several actions taken by the Legislature and Governor that may be of interest to your section. Any memoranda and letters drafted by the section in support or opposition to legislation was shared by the Government Relations team, and the team looks forward to working with the section as we move into the 2024 Legislative Session.

Section Legislative Engagement in the 2023 Session

Not Passed by the Legislature:

- A227(Rosenthal L)/S4264(Webb): Relates to women's health in correctional facilities. WILS supported this legislation with a Memo in Support (#2).
- A3883(Braunstein)/S2450(Krueger): Includes contact via text, email, private message, direct
 message or other electronic communication in the definition of the offense of aggravated
 harassment in the second degree. WILS supported this legislation with a Memo in Support (#1).

Other Legislation of Interest

\$108A(Krueger)/A1283(Seawright) - Equal Rights Amendment (ERA): Relates to equal protection.
This is the second year in a row in which the legislature has passed this amendment to section 11
of article 1 of the state constitution and it will now be put on the ballot to be voted on by the
public in the 2024 general election.
