We travel to the picturesque fishing village of **Cojimar**. Ernest Hemingway loved this little seaside town. He kept his boat, **El Pilar**, in the harbor of Cojimar, and he used this village setting for his story The Old Man and the Sea, which won him the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1954.

After enjoying a quick cocktail in Cojimar, we continue to Lunch at Paladar II Divino.

After lunch, we travel to **Finca Vigia**, Ernest Hemingway's home in **San Francisco de Paula**. The home contains original furniture, artwork, personal memorabilia & other objects collected by the author. Of special importance is the author's library containing thousands of irreplaceable letters & telegrams, photographs, scrapbooks, manuscripts, & galley proofs.

Return to Havana. Remainder of afternoon/evening free.

Option/TRACK 2: FARM VISIT / LAS TERRAZAS

We depart for **Finca Villa Hortensia**, a farm in the Artemisa province (APPROX. 50-minute drive) to learn about sustainable agriculture in Cuba.

After our farm visit, we travel to the pioneering eco -community of **Las Terrazas in Sierra del Rosario**. This biosphere came under UNESCO protection in 1984 due to the success of the reforestation project. It is now home to 117 bird species, including 12 that are endemic. During our visit to Las Terrazas, we see the ruins of a **French Coffee Plantation** built in 1801 by the French who escaped Haiti after the 1791 Haitian revolution.

Lunch at Cafetal Buenavista or El Campesino at Las Terrazas.

After lunch, we continue for a guided tour of the Village of Las Terrazas including a visit the famous **Cafe Maria** for delightfully rich Cuban coffee. Here you may also have the opportunity to purchase locally grown/roasted Cuban coffee.

Return to Havana. Remainder of afternoon/evening free.

Suggested optional entertainment: Tropicana Night Club or Havana Queens Show.

Morning Session: Time to be announced **Economic Reform & The New Cuban Economy**

Presentation by Juan Triana, of the University of Havana. During his lecture, Mr. Triana will delve into Cuba's recent economic reforms including the evolution of private property rights in Cuba, the relaxation of state intervention and Cuba's integration in the global economy.
