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GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

The *New York Business Law Journal* (“NYBLJ”) is the official publication of the Business Law Section (“BLS”) of the New York State Bar Association (“NYSBA”). The NYBLJ features peer-written substantive articles relating to the practice of business law, with special emphasis on the State of New York, and is designed to educate and provide practice-oriented insight and guidance relevant to the business law practitioner. The NYBLJ is published twice per year and distributed to the BLS’s membership free of charge.

Topic. Topics should be related to the practice of business law, relevant to practitioners located in the State of New York, and timely.

Article Length. Articles should be a minimum of 1,500 words but the NYBLJ is open to publishing articles of all lengths.

Style. The writing should be appropriate for a readership that comprises primarily lawyers, with a focus on practical insight and guidance. Authors should avoid excess verbiage, long quotations and jargon.

Endnotes. All references must be completely and accurately cited as endnotes, using the citation style of the most recent edition of *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation*.

Author Biography. Please include a brief description of your current professional affiliation.

Manuscript Preparation. Use endnotes rather than footnotes or embedded citations; number pages; use Microsoft Word; and submit manuscripts as e-mail attachments.

Prior Publication. Submissions may appear elsewhere in print (for example, as an article or client alert on an author’s law firm website or in another legal publication), as long as permission to reprint has been obtained and provided to NYSBA prior to publication in the NYBLJ.

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
