How to Enter:

- Eligible articles must be written by a currentlyenrolled or graduating student at a New York State Law School or by a New York State resident at any ABA-accredited law school outside of New York State.
- 2. **Eligible papers** include notes, comments and articles and should generally be 20-30 pages in length, with footnotes. In no event may papers exceed 50 pages, with footnotes.
- 3. **Eligible papers** may address any topic of general interest to the antitrust law community, including topics relating to civil and criminal antitrust law, competition policy, consumer protection, and international competition law

- 4. Jointly prepared papers are not eligible.
- 5. Go to the Antitrust Section on the NYSBA website and click on the "Awards, Fellowships & Scholarship" section and then scroll down to "Writing Competition." Download an Entry Form. And submit an electronic copy of the paper, along with a completed Entry Form, by May 30, 2024 to:
